

We are now offering fencing and karate as well as utilising the hall space before school. This means that we are able to offer more children physical activity opportunities on a daily basis.</p> <p>Teachers are ensuring the children use the 5-a-day TV (along with our resources) on days the children do not do PE.</p> <p>The Maths of the Day resources are providing staff with practical ideas to teach the maths national curriculum to ensure our children are active.</p> <p>Teachers are able to delivering high quality gymnastics lesson which aren't hindered by limited resources/equipment.</p>	<p>We rotate our children attending after school clubs on a termly basis, so that we ensure as many children as possible have the opportunity to experience to sports on offer.</p> <p>The staff are building up a bank of ideas to develop their practical maths teaching and will continue to do so whilst we subscribe to this resource.</p>

Teachers are feeling more confident at delivering lessons from all of the units on the curriculum map and ensure there is a high level of challenge in all lessons.	During Sports Week next year we will aim to introduce the children to different sports and arrange out of hours clubs for them.
Provide a top up swimming sessions for those children in Year 6 that cannot swim 25 metres.	Liaise with a local school to see if we can share swimming resources. Book sessions and ensure hire of the pool. Identify the children.	£350 Additional swimming sessions	Four of our year 6 children who were unable to swim to swim confidently over 25 metres or use a range of strokes effectively had additional swimming lessons and made rapid progress. They left St Catherine's able to swim confidently for 25 metres and had developed their stroke techniques.
