Online Safety

We understand that it can be hard for parents to keep up to date with the apps and websites that your children are using online and therefore we thought it would be useful to share this <u>website</u> which has been put together by Education Child Protection. The aim of the website is to keep parents informed about the games, apps and websites your children are currently using. When looking up a game, website or app you will be given a summary of what it is, what the minimum age is, what the online safety experts say and safety tips to consider. An example is shown below.

Parents can also sign up to regular updates from the company to ensure you are kept informed of any updates to the website.

FORTNITE

MINIMUM AGE: 12

WHAT IS IT? 100 players leap out of a plane on to a small island and then fight to the death until only one is left WHAT WE SAY: Treat with caution.

The content of the game is not a massive issue - although unadvisable for young children

There is a lot of chat with strangers within the game, so a good idea to talk to children about disabling the chat altogether

A very addictive game, due to its repetitive nature, so time limits are highly recommended.

SAFETY TIPS TO CONSIDER:

Safer to have private parties with just friends than playing with strangers
Chat function can be disabled
Children become very addicted
