Pick out features such as roads, important places and look at how these are marked.</p>	<p>Use toy vehicles in paint to create different kinds of tracks, look at the different patterns that can be made.</p>

<p>Look at the numbers on the front of buses. Can you recognise them and order them from smallest to largest.</p>	<p>Create a ticket office / train station where you can book tickets, plan journeys, find out information about buses, trains etc.</p>	<p>Draw a map of your route to school.</p>	<p>Tell your grown up about a special journey you went on. Draw a picture of this journey.</p>
<p>Draw/ write a postcard to a friend.</p>	<p>Create a small or larger scale train, carriages, cars and buses using construction materials</p>	<p>Make your own map for your bus and other vehicles, where does it go to and where does it stop on the way?</p>	<p>Make different vehicles out of playdough.</p>
<p>Count how many different colour vehicles you see on your local walk. Make a tally chart.</p>	<p>Make a boat out of modelling clay/play dough. Whose airplane flies the furthest?</p>	<p>Play the traffic light game. Follow the instructions: Red- stop Amber- walk Green- run</p>
