Risk Assessment Update

Thank you for continuing to keep our school community as safe as possible. We will be continuing with the majority of our risk assessments next half term particularly the start and finish times of each year group and the different entrance and exit gates. We will make changes to our playtime and lunchtime arrangements. Bubbles will be increased during these times only to accommodate one other year group so that the children can have a scheduled playtime on the playground and a session in the dining hall for lunch. Nursery and Reception will be combined. Years 1&2 will have their play and diping room session together. Years 3 &4 will be bubbled together and Years 5 & 6 will be together. The children will be on separate year group tables whilst in the dining hall. If we do have a positive case of COVID we will contact Barnet Public Health who will advise us accordingly. We hope the systems we have in place will prevent an entire bubble having to isolate.

Walk to School Week

We had a fantastic Walk to School Week last week, so many active journeys completed either by walking, scooting, cycling or park and striding. Congratulations to 1Y for completing 149 active journeys cover the course of the week – the most in the school.

Reminders:

Parking - Please park considerately! Do not obstruct our neighbours' driveways. Also if you park in the section of Vale Drive that we then close, we cannot let you out again until the barriers are removed.

Litter - our neighbours have noticed a marked increase in litter in their gardens - please ensure all your litter is taken home with you and disposed of properly, not inadvertently dropped on the way home. Please protect our neighbourhood.

Road closure area - it is vital that the children are kept with you at all times and not allowed to play in the closed road. Emergency and resident vehicles still have right of way through this section and we all need to be vigilant of this.

Water bottles - Covid restrictions mean that our water fountains at school remain closed and it is therefore essential that your child brings a water bottle to school with them every day.



We are delighted to inform you, this week we have received confirmation that we have been awarded our Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM). Contact Tracing


