On Friday 8th October we celebrated 'World Mental Health Day' at St Catherine's. The theme this year was 'Mental Health in an Unequal World' and we all discussed what that meant and why looking after our Mental Health is important. We thought about ways in which we could boost others Mental Health whilst also ensuring that we are monitoring and caring for our own. All of the classes enjoyed revisiting this topic and all the children completed an activity linked to this day.

Online Safety – Squid Game

Squid Game is a programme found on Netflix and although it has a 15 rating, clips and images from the show have been uploaded on to social media sites such as TikTok. It has been reported that children with access to these social media platforms have inadvertently viewed explicit scenes from the programme. Online challenges based on the show have also been seen, where people take part in seemingly innocent children's games. However, on the show, characters are executed when they lose a game. Videos of people reenacting this are going viral online. There is also a Squid Game Challenge app, sometimes also known as K-Game challenge. What's particularly notable is that the iTunes story rates this game as 12+ whereas the Android rating is only 3+, meaning young children may be able to download the device even when parental controls are in place. If you hear your child talking about Squid Game, it would be a timely opportunity to remind them that the program is not intended for children and contains many scenes that could be extremely upsetting. Remind your children not to download apps without permission, even when parental controls are set up.

Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus. "Teacher," they said, "there is something we want you to do for us."
