The children designed their own socks with keywords and illustrations of hobbies that describe them. This would be an ideal opportunity to learn without a big financial outlay for the instrument. We would hire these out at a cost of £15.00 a term, which is below average hire rates. The cost of these instruments is around £150.00.

Just One Tree Day Success

We were delighted to receive a certificate this week from Just One Tree informing us that the money we raised means 284 seeds will be chosen and planted by their partners in one of their nurseries. Once the next rainy season is upon us, our seedlings will be transported to their carefully selected new homes, where they will be planted and nurtured over the coming years. Our school's 'forest' of 284 trees will remove approximately 87.47 tonnes of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere over the next 25 years.

Online Safety - Apple Update

Apple has recently launched a new operating system for the iPhone and iPad. Online safety company, Ineqe, has looked closely at the new iOS 15 and has found that the new FaceTime call features could leave children vulnerable. In iOS 15, the user can create a shareable link that could be joined from a web browser, rather than directly calling someone on FaceTime. If someone were to share this link on a public platform, it could mean that any stranger could join the call. It is important to ensure that your child is not sharing FaceTime links unless you know about it and can supervise who and where they are sending the link to.
