

Collaborative Learning

- Changed weekly.
- Children must persevere even if they don't normally choose to work together – that's real life!
- Talk partner evaluations:
 - Weekly
 - Two stars and a wish
 - Children agree what they think a good talk partner is.
 - They are accountable for their feedback it must be constructive.
- Celebration assemblies to share learning with whole Key Stage and Headteacher occur weekly.

Questioning

- No hands up.
- ORandomiser/Iollipop sticks used.
 - oThis encourages children not to switch off in the lesson, and always participate.
- Talk partner discussion is given to help children form their responses.
- OPause, Pounce, Bounce
- oFinger voting
- Show me on your whiteboard

Behaviour and Attitude to Learning



- •Three step escalation:
 - Reminder,
 - Warning,
 - Timeout
- •Children will be given explanations for why their behaviour was not appropriate
- Alternative choices will be explained
- •Parents will be informed if their child has had a timeout and if there is consistent and repetitive timeout, member of staff will contact parents to help support choices.

- •High expectations of behaviour across all aspects of school life.
- •Children will be celebrated for positive behaviour by being on the star.
- Behaviour Charts are reset at the end of each session.
- •Class marble jar is used to reward whole class achievements and collectively positive behavior
- •Children sent for Head Teacher stickers for outstanding personal achievements.

Curriculum Maps & Topics


- At St Catherine's we have ensured our curriculum map meets the needs of all our learners.

Maths in Year 4



- 3 levels of challenge
 - Children must consider carefully what the task is and whether they feel they can attempt it from their understanding of the input.
 - No child should assume that they will choose the same level of challenge every lesson.
 - Aspirational and motivational names given to the challenges e.g. amazing, fantastic...
- All concepts are learned through three cognitive steps include practical, pictorial and abstract.



Pictorial


Representing mathematical concepts explored practically through diagrams and pictures.

Whole unknown...




4 children go to the cinema. They each pay £15. How much do they spend altogether?



In Summary



Statutory Multiplication Assessment

- There will be a statutory multiplication assessment in June.
- MTC is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times tables questions. Your child will answer 3 practice questions before moving on to the official check and will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.
- It will assess whether your child can recall fluently their times tables up to 12.
- All children should be practising for rapid, fluent recall of all their times tables – daily is most effective.
- One times table to focus per week.

Literacy in Year 4

Developing a personal writing style

- More complex sentence structure emerging. We use the Alan Peat sentence types. They will learn the Year 4 ones.
- Secure and consistent use of full stops and capital letters and emerging security with commas for lists and clauses
- Wide vocabulary of adjectives and adverbs
- Writing stamina handwriting practice continues
- Peer assessment key feature of writing process.
- We encourage the children to use full sentences.

Reading - VIPERS

- Whole class guided reading happens four times a week
- Opportunity to change library books weekly
- Commenting on writers use of language and using techniques learnt in their own writing
- Continuing to focus on fluency as this reduces barriers developing other comprehension skills
- Focus on comprehension and inference within a smaller passage in depth

Literacy Milestones

- Year 3/4 spelling list securely learned.
 - Going forward ten spellings will be sent home to learn each week focusing on a particular rule or pattern.
 - Children using adverbials to open sentences punctuated with a comma.
- Reading chapter books with fluency and responding personally and critically to the text.
- High standard of spoken Standard English.

R.E.in Year 4

- The Way, The Truth & The Life- Two session of Learning a week equal to 10% of curriculum.
- Collective worship happens daily in addition to prayers for morning, lunch and end of the day.
- Prayer services and masses
- Class Masses
- Visits to our local parishes Mass, Stations of the Cross

PSHE

- Ten Ten's new programme for Catholic primary schools, Life to the Full, teaches Relationships Education and Health Education.
- RHE is a statutory subject for all schools
- We are embracing "the challenges of creating a happy and successful adult life" by giving pupils knowledge "that will enable them to make informed decisions about their wellbeing, health and relationships" (DFE Statutory Guidance).
- Life to the Full is a fully resourced Scheme of Work in Relationships Education for Catholic primary schools which embraces and fulfils the new statutory curriculum. Children will revisit the same topics at an age-appropriate stage through their school life.
- The programme includes:
- Lesson plans for EYFS to Year 6; High-quality videos created by Ten Ten specifically for UK- based Catholic primary schools; Programme of prayer and worship music to accompany the scheme of work; Online Parent Portal for links to home.

Year 4

- Children are expected to come to school in their PE kits on Monday (swimming) and Thursday.
- French with Madame Reeve and PE with Mr. Reilly on a Thursday afternoon.
- Year 4 will have music on a Wednesday with Ms. Draper.

Spelling

- Every week we will informally test the children's spelling.
- We will hand out the spellings every Thursday.
- The spelling test will take place on the following Friday.

Home Learning



- Sent by email on Thursday.
- Spellings Year 4 spelling list downloadable from .gov. Used with no-nonsense spelling strategies: eg. Look cover write, pyramid words, wordless, drawing outlines of words, research etymology, word maps. Spelling patterns are learned as well as words from the statutory list.
- Times tables/mental maths
- Daily reading at home
