Theme: Vegetables Learning nouns for ten vegetables with word puzzles, presentations and a song. Using definite article "les" and adding an "s" to the end of the noun to make plurals. Practising using new and revised French by role playing buying vegetables at a market. New phrases, "Je voudrais" (1 would like), "un kilo/un demi kilo/deux kilos" etc Phonics and pronunciation: <i>ch</i> in <i>champignon</i> (like <i>sh</i> in English) <i>on</i> in oignon ( <i>n</i> sound in throat) Liason- when an s at the end of word must be pronounced which is unusual (ask your child about "ketchup and honey"!)	Creating compositions in response to an animation (Theme: Mountains): Listening to music and considering the narrative it could represent. Paying close attention to the dynamics, pitch and tempo and how they change.
