The Way, the Truth and the Life.


Dear Parents,

Nursery and Reception—New Life

"Jesus' life, death and resurrection are the central event of all human history and at the heart of faith."

This half term, the children in the Nursery and the Reception classes will be looking at New Life.

Throughout this topic, the children will begin to understand that Jesus rose from the dead and to experience the Easter joy through celebrations.

They will learn about the story of the disciples discovering the empty tomb, and learn that Jesus appeared to the disciples.

They will begin to understand the special gift of joy and peace that Jesus gave to the

disciples (John 20: 19-21) and can give to us as well.

They will also hear the story of Jesus going back to his Father in heaven and that one day we can go there.

At Home

You could help your children by ...


- Planting or making an Easter garden

- Look for signs of 'new life' buds on trees, flowers blooming, lambs etc.

- Practise the Sign of the Cross and saying formal prayers Our Father and the Hail Mary with your children. And making up some of their own prayers.



Year 1—The Resurrection



Jesus Christ's Resurrection - and the risen Christ himself - is the principle and source of our future resurrection: 'Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep... For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.'

Catechism of the Catholic Church

This half term, the children in Year 1 will be looking at the Resurrection.

The children will learn that Jesus

appeared to the disciples in the Upper Room and will think about the times when we have experienced great joy and surprise.

They will learn that Jesus helped the disciples to understand that he was truly risen and was with them (John 21:9-14) and this made them very happy.

They will learn that when Thomas heard that Jesus was alive he did not believe it .

They will also become more aware that sometimes like Thomas, we don't

understand what is happening.

At Home

You could help your children by:

- Reading stories with them from the Bible about Easter and Pentecost

- Draw pictures about them and label what they are.

- Go one to www.tere.org and complete the interactive activities

Year 2—Eastertide

"God's Self-Revelation is perfected in us the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth, promised by Jesus and revealed at Pentecost. It is the Holy Spirit who forms and guides God's People to know God and enter into communion with God through Jesus Christ."

This half term, the children in Year 2 will be looking at Eastertide.

The children will learn that Jesus rose from the dead and still lives to be with us.

They will learn that Jesus told the disciples that he

would go back to Heaven but promised that the Holy Spirit would come.

They will learn that Jesus returned to Heaven and promised to return again and that this gives us hope.

They will also know the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and know that the Holy Spirit is promised to us.



At Home

You could help your children by:


- Talking about how the Holy Spirit helps us.

- At Mass, have a close look at the Easter Candle.

- The children could talk about what they have learnt in class.

- Go online to www.tere.org and complete the interactive activities

Year 3—Celebrating Easter and Pentecost



"The celebration of the gift of salvation takes shape in the seasons and feasts of the Church's year. Liturgy involves the conscious, active and fruitful participation of everyone."

This half term, the children in Year 3 will be looking at Easter and Pentecost.

Learning ABOUT our Catholic Faith

The children will learn that God the Father raised Jesus from the dead on Easter Sunday.

They will learn that because Jesus rose from the dead we too will rise from the dead.

They will learn the story of the appearance of Jesus on the road to Emmaus and to Thomas.

They will know the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

They will also learn how the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost changed the disciples.

Learning FROM our Catholic Faith

The children will have the chance to:

- Think about what we should do on Sundays to remember what Jesus has done for us.

- Reflect on times when we need the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Participate in a liturgical celebration for Pentecost and go to mass on Pentecost Sunday.

At Home

You could help your children by:

- Talk about how the Church celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus
- Find the story of what happened at Pentecost with your child from the Library or the Internet
- Discuss how they would have felt if they were one of the disciples.
- Go online to www.tere.org and complete the interactive activities

Year 4—The Mission of the Church

"Christ inaugurated the Church when he began to proclaim Good News and through the Church he fulfils and reveals God's plan to unite all things in him. Christ gave his Church a structure in calling and choosing Twelve apostles. With them and their successors he shares his mission, his power and authority. In the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost the Church was revealed and its mission (apostolate) to the nations was begun... The Church's mission is that of Christ its head. The ultimate purpose of this mission is to enable all people to share in the communion of life and love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit."

This half term, the children in Year 4 will be looking at the mission of the Church.

Learning ABOUT our Catholic Faith

The children will learn that Jesus appeared to the disciples after his resurrection;

They will learn that Peter was chosen by Jesus to play a special role in the Church and that Jesus gave his followers a mission - to spread the Good News to others;

They will learn that Jesus sent his Spirit to help them at Pentecost and develop an understand that this was the beginning of the Church.

They will know how Saints Peter and Stephen helped to spread the Good News by their lives and their death and how Saul became Paul and how he spread the Good News.

They will also learn how the Church today shares in this mission.

Learning FROM our Catholic Faith

The children will have the chance to:

- Appreciate that we too have a role to play in spreading the Good News.
- Identify ways we can spread the Good News in our lives.
- Consider ways in which we can support a mission.




At Home

You could help your children by:

- Discuss how St Peter helped to spread the Good News by his life and death.
- Draw and write a short character description of Paul before and after his conversion.
- Go online to www.tere.org and complete the interactive activities

Year 5—Life in the Risen Jesus



"Prayer is a living relationship with God in, with and through Jesus Christ; an encounter which takes place in the intimacy of the heart of each person. All prayer, whether private or public is God's gift, the action of the holy Spirit in us and an

expression of this living relationship. Prayer is an expression of the universal search for God and of the response of faith to God's Self-Revelation."

This half term, the children in Year 5 will be looking at Life in the Risen Jesus.

Learning ABOUT our Catholic Faith

The children will develop an understanding that Jesus is risen from the dead.

They will learn the story of the appearance of Jesus to Mary of Magdala. (John 20: 11-18) and learn that the risen Jesus is present among us in different ways.

They will learn about Jesus' teaching, his example on prayer and have a greater understanding of the 'Our Father'.

They will learn that we can pray in different ways, for example how to pray the Rosary.

They will also learn about the Glorious Mysteries and how they help us to think about the Resurrection of Jesus.

Learning FROM our Catholic Faith

The children will have the chance to:

- Appreciate that Jesus is present in our lives.
- Recognise the importance of making time for prayer each day.
- Reflect on the meaning of some traditional prayers, e.g. 'Our Father'.
- Experience a guided meditation on the Resurrection.

At Home

You could help your children by:

- Reading and discussing the story of Mary of Magdala.
- Show your child a Rosary and discuss with them how we use it to pray.
- Go online to www.tere.org and complete the interactive activities

Lent is a new beginning, a path leading to the certain goal of Easter, Christ's victory over death. Christians are asked to return to God "with all their hearts" to refuse to settle for mediocrity and to grow in friendship with the Lord. Jesus is the faithful friend who never abandons us. Even when we sin, he patiently awaits our return; by that patient expectation, he shows us his readiness to forgive.

Lent is a favourable season for deepening our spiritual life through the means of sanctification offered us by the Church: fasting, prayer and almsgiving. At the basis of everything is the word of God, which during this season we are invited to hear and ponder more deeply. I would now like to consider the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. Let us find inspiration in this meaningful story, for it provides a key to understanding what we need to do in order to attain true happiness and eternal life. It exhorts us to sincere conversion.

The parable begins by presenting its two main characters. The poor man is described in greater detail: he is wretched and lacks the strength even to stand. Lying before the door of the rich man, he


fed on the crumbs falling from his table. His body is full of sores. The picture is one of great misery; it portrays a man disgraced and pitiful.

The scene is even more dramatic if we consider that the poor man is called Lazarus: a name full of promise, which literally means God helps. This character is not anonymous. His features are clearly delineated and he appears as an individual with his own story. While practically invisible to the rich man, we see and know him as someone familiar. He becomes a face, and as such, a gift, a priceless treasure, a human being whom God loves and cares for, despite his concrete condition as an outcast.

Lazarus teaches us that other persons are a gift. A right relationship with people consists in gratefully recognizing their value. Even the poor person at the door of the rich is not a nuisance, but a summons to conversion and to change.

The parable first invites us to open the doors of our heart to others because each person is a gift, whether it be our neighbour or an anonymous pauper.

Year 6—The Work of the Apostles

So that this call should resound throughout the world, Christ sent forth the apostles he had chosen, commissioning them to proclaim the gospel: 'Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.'

Strengthened by this mission, the apostles 'went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message by the signs that attended it.'"

This half term, the children in Year 6 will be looking at the work of the Apostles.

Learning ABOUT our Catholic Faith

The children will learn how the Apostles changed when they received the Holy Spirit.

They will learn about the early Christian community (Acts 3:1-10; 4:32-35)

They will learn about the cure of a lame man and know about the first conversions, as well as Peter's address to the people.

They will learn about the persecution of the Apostles, know the story of Peter in prison and how he escaped.

They will also learn about the preaching of Paul.

Learning FROM our Catholic Faith

The children will have the chance to:

- Reflect on what we can learn today from the early Christians;
- Be aware of the power of the Holy Spirit working in the Apostles and that this same Spirit is given to us;
- Reflect on response people made to the preaching of the Apostles and how important their words are for us today.

At Home

You could help your children by

- Looking for information about Saints and talking about their lives.
- Discuss the role of the Apostles and how they changed before and after the Resurrection.
- Discuss how we can all be followers of Jesus in our everyday lives.
