WHAT IS A RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL ?



- The Rights Respecting Schools Award (RRSA) recognises achievement in putting the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) at the heart of a school's planning, policies, practice and ethos.
- A rights-respecting school not only teaches about children's rights but also models rights and respect in all its relationships: between teachers / adults and children, between adults and between children.

The universality of the CRC

provides a clear link for children between building up their rights-respecting school, understanding their rights and the need for children's rights to be realised everywhere.

Children and young people in rights respecting schools develop a stronger sense of the need to act for global justice.





WHY TEACH ABOUT RIGHTS? With rights come responsibilities. This helps us to develop a sense of our responsibility to respect the rights of others.

WHAT DO WE MEAN BY RIGHTS?



THE RIGHT TO KNOW!




St Catherine's Primary and Nursery School is a Rights Respecting School because we are passionate about Children's Rights.

We put the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child at the heart of everything we do. Here are some of the rights we have concentrated on.



Article 19 The right to **protection from harm**

Article 23 The right to **support**



Article 24 The right to have access to good **medical care**

Article 27 The right to **housing** and **clothing**







Article 29 The right to an education that develops their personality and talents to the fullest

Article 30 The right to practise one's own **culture**

Article 14 The right to practise one's own **religion**

Article 2 The right to be treated **fairly**

Article 24 The right to access clean **water** and nutritious **food**
